The Lambeth Safeguarding Children Partnership is a partnership between health, police, local authority, and education to work closely and effectively with all statutory and voluntary organisations in Lambeth to help protect and safeguard the welfare and wellbeing of children and young people and ensure their best outcomes.

Lambeth Safeguarding Children Partnership courses are free of charge to all partner agencies and nonprofit organizations. The training workshops are mostly all virtual. However, the LSCP will be re-introducing face to face training for some of the sessions which are being planned from September 2023. The courses are all highlighted within this programme and can be booked via Eventbrite. A certificate is provided for all courses.

SAFEGUARDING TRAINING LEVELS EXPLAINED

LEVEL 1

- Introductory courses that cover basic safeguarding content. You will gain knowledge on what safeguarding is and explore how to recognize signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect and also how to report your concerns.
- **Suitable for**: Anyone that works with children and need an introduction to safeguarding. For e.g. youth workers, nursery staff, sport coordinators, volunteers and local authority staff.

LEVEL 2

- Intermediate courses that covers Level 1 topics in detail as well as outlining what steps are taken after a concern has been expressed. These are usually suited for those that have a 'duty of care' towards children.
- **Suitable for**: Those working with children whose role requires more advanced knowledge and skills in safeguarding. For e.g. teachers, social workers and early years practitioners.

LEVEL 3

- Advanced safeguarding courses that provide relevant information and guidance for those who are in a position of management or responsible for making key decisions with regards to safeguarding in their organization
- **Suitable for**: Designated safeguarding officers, nursery managers, GP's, headteachers, local authority staff and community and voluntary organisation leads.

LEVEL 4 – The LSCP also includes bespoke training and recommended training from safeguarding practice reviews, national reviews and learning practice reports. These are **Level 4** courses that are suitable for **safeguarding champions** that will ensure the learning is cascaded in their organizations.

- Explain the different learning styles and identify how your own way of learning may influence training.
- Identify and describe different training methods and decide on the suitability of each for your training session.
- Produce learning objectives that meet the criteria of 'behaviour, 'condition' and 'standard'.

Understanding Trauma: Responding to a violent incident

Course Overview:

Who?

All people working with or who have contact with children and young people.

Why?

To Equip front-line practitioners to take a trauma-informed response to violent incidents

What?

The course will help practitioners:

To understand how to take a trauma-informed response concerning a violent incident (for example, a stabbing, shooting, domestic abuse, physical abuse, and police-related violence).

Learning Objectives:

- Understanding the definition of a violent incident and the potential psychological, social, and biological impact.
- Exploring possible interventions after a traumatic incident (including violence prevention responses)
- Planning with the (potential) end in mind (trauma responsiveness before an incident)

Multi-agency Safeguarding Training (Level 3)

(Virtual delivery using Microsoft Teams)

Course Overview:

Who?

Professionals who work directly with children and young people in Lambeth. For example, pediatricians, GPs, youth workers, Early Years workers, residential staff, midwives, school nurses, health visitors, sexual health staff, teachers, probation staff, sports club welfare officers, and those working with adults in, for example, learning disability, mental health, alcohol, and drug misuse services.

Why?

To enable delegates to develop knowledge and skills in multi-agency working to safeguard children and promote their welfare.

What?

The course will explore:

- Relevant legislation, key terms, and processes
- Lambeth Thresholds: Tiers of need, assessment, and referral processes
- Protocols for information sharing.
- Roles and responsibilities across multi-agency network
- Learning points from Serious Case and Practice Reviews
- How to safeguard yourself

Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) Awareness Raising Training

Course Overview:

This Multi-Agency training course will increase Practitioners' knowledge and confidence in identifying female genital mutilation (FGM) and in responding effectively to protect:

Who?

Professionals who work directly with children and young people in Lambeth.

What?

Aims of the training:

- Improved recognition of terminology specific to cultures, in various languages and the definition and types of FGM
- Support the ability of professionals to recognise risk factors and indicators of FGM
- Offer tips, considerations and local signposting resources for engaging women and girls in services and for opening discussions on FGM with those impacted, their families and other professionals.
- Explore the beliefs used to justify the practice and the importance of engaging with men and other caregivers.
- Understand the longitudinal impacts of FGM on girls and women across various domains and explore interventions and supportive services.
- Understand the safeguarding responsibilities, reporting mandates and applicable UK laws.

Learning outcomes:

- Recognise the definition of FGM, culturally and linguistically specific terminology and discuss the differences between types of FGM.
- Identify the risk factors for and indicators of FGM and the varied impacts on girls and women.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the applicable UK law, including the Female
 Genital Mutilation Act and mandatory reporting duties, and the role of professionals
 and multi-agency communication in safeguarding and reporting.
- Discuss techniques and considerations for engaging girls and women in discussions and local services

Safeguarding Young People Outside of the Home (Contextual Safeguarding)

Course Overview:

Who? All people working with or who have contact with children and young people.

Why? This course will help professionals to effectively identify, assess and plan to safeguard children and young people from harm outside of their families.

What?

The training will set out the context of the risk young people face in Lambeth - from criminal exploitation, sexual exploitation, to peer-on-peer abuse and serious violence.

By the end of the session, you will:

- Confidently use Lambeth's Levels of Need guidance and contextual safeguarding tools to identify and effectively assess risk for individuals, groups, and locations/spaces
- Be able to map out a young person's peer, family, and relationships, and use this to inform safety planning.
- Gain confidence in identifying meaningful actions to address specific contextual risks (for example, drug debt, image online, questions to ask)
- Be able to develop an effective multiagency plan to tackle risk/harm in specific locations and for peer groups.
- Confidently deliver the key learning points to your team/service to cascade the learning.

Unconscious Bias and Cultural Competence in Safeguarding Children

Course Overview:

Who?

Professionals who work directly with children and young people in Lambeth.

Why?

This course aims to enhance practitioners' knowledge, skills and understanding of how race, culture and/or faith and belief systems can impact on our safeguarding children practice. The course will also focus on key learning from Serious Case Reviews, the roles and responsibilities of practitioners, the legal framework and how to identify risk factors.

What?

This course will explore the role bias can play in assessments and the understanding of family dynamics, by exploring personal beliefs and expectations.

The discussions will examine how we measure risk to children from different backgrounds. The course will also use some case examples to explore how this unfolds in practice.

Outcomes:

By the end of the course participants will have:

• An increased understanding of the influences of culture and faith/belief systems on parenting; • Heightened confidence in talking about their own and other people's attitudes and beliefs and the impact on providing services; •Demonstrated an increased awareness of the role of bias in decision making using published reviews as examples; • Explored essential procedures for safeguarding; • Examined local issues.

What?

Participants are introduced to Listen Up's Professional Inter-Adultification Model.

Learning Outcomes:

- To explore notions of vulnerability and childhood and how these are applied to some children more than others.
- To understand the broad concepts of intersectionality and adultification
- To identify ways to guard against adultification in practice.
- To review findings from serious case reviews relating to child criminal exploitation

Children and Young People Impacted by Domestic Abuse

Course Overview:

A one-day course to enable delegates to develop knowledge and skills around working with children impacted from domestic abuse.

Who?

All practitioners working with children and families in Lambeth.

Why?

The course will provide knowledge and skills for practitioners in supporting children's best outcomes who have experienced living with domestic abuse.

What?

The voice of children and young people is often missed in cases of domestic abuse. This course is aimed at people who may encounter children and young people affected by domestic abuse as part of their work. This course will explore the ways in which domestic abuse affects children and young people and will help build confidence and skills around effectively responding to their needs.

Course Content

- Understanding children and young people's experience of coercive control
- The impact of domestic abuse on the developing brain
- Trauma informed approaches and communication
- How does domestic abuse impact children and young people's relationship with their parents.
- Effectively responding in a child-centred way

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the course, participants will:

- Gain deeper understanding of the impacts of domestic abuse on children and young people.
- Feel increased confidence in supporting children whilst living in domestic abuse environments and during contact arrangements with parents following separation.
- Have a deeper understanding of the ways in which trauma impacts on children and young people and trauma-informed ways of supporting them.
- Be able to signpost children and parents to relevant support services.

London Safeguarding Children Partnership Threshold-Continuum of need matrix Introduction

Who?

Professionals who work directly with children and young people in Lambeth – and their parents and carers.

Why?

This is a framework for professionals who are working with children, young people, and families. It aims to help identify when a child may need additional support to achieve their full potential.

What?

It provides information on the levels of need and gives examples of some of the factors that may indicate a child or young person requires additional support. By undertaking assessments and offering services on a continuum of help and support, professionals can be flexible and respond to different levels of need in different children and families. The framework recognises that however complex a child's needs, universal services e.g., education and health, will always be provided alongside any specialist additional service.

The continuum of need matrix is not an exhaustive list. It provides examples that can be used as a tool to assist assessment, planning and decision making for professionals working to safeguard and promote the welfare of children.

Serious Incidents response briefing

Who?

This course is for all safeguarding leads within partner agencies within Lambeth.

Why?

To ensure all safeguarding leads on partner agencies are fully briefed on the Lambeth Safeguarding Children Partnership's processes in response to Serious Incidents, referrals for Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews and Methodology and Timeline for commissioned reviews

What?

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of the session, you will have knowledge:

- What qualifies as a 'serious incident'.
- Identify the steps to make a referral for a CSPR using the correct process.
- Articulate the statutory duties involved in a Rapid Review, including responding to Form 2 (Initial Scoping and Information Sharing) within 5 working days, sending the Safeguarding Lead to the Rapid Review meeting, and feeding into the Rapid Review Report (Form 3) at the Rapid Review meeting.
- Complete a timeline with clear, concise, and quality information, including a clear division between factual events and hindsight analysis.
- Complete a quality Individual Management Review, sharing the key learnings and analysis with the LSCP
